2. ASA³ EVERITT (*MOSES*², *JOHN*¹) was born 21 Aug 1747 in Upper Mt. Bethel Twp., Northampton Co., PA, and died 29 Aug 1794. He married MARGARET. She was born 31 Dec 1750, and died 14 Oct 1800.

Notes for ASA EVERITT:

Asa Everitt's Last Will and Testament, written 9 Aug 1794 and proved 11 Nov 1794, locates Asa in Upper Mt. Bethel Twp., Northampton Co., PA and identifies his wife as Margaret, and his children as Sarah, Elisha, Mary, William, Joseph, Susannah, John, and James. Executors were son Elisha and Moses Everitt of Upper Mt. Bethel, and Edward Hunt of Knowlton, Sussex Co., NJ. Witnesses were John J. Hendrix and Thomas Beer (Bk.2, p.271).

It is worth noting that John Eyerman's 1897 "Will Abstracts of Northampton County, PA: 1752-1802" indicates that Asa and Margaret Everitt were, along with Thomas Purry, witnesses to the 1780 Last Will and Testament of William Bear, of Mt. Bethel Twp. William's wife is identified as Mary, and his children as Robert, Thomas, William, Peter, Abigail, Sarah, Martha, Jane, and Mary. Also listed is brother-in-law John Lowry, who was executor, along with William's wife, Mary. Whether son Thomas was the Thomas Beer of Asa Everitt's Will is uncertain.

4. ABNER³ EVERITT (*MOSES*², *JOHN*¹) was born 03 Feb 1754 in Mt. Bethel Twp., Northampton Co., PA, and died 03 Aug 1794 in Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ. He married SUSANNAH LEGGETT 03 Feb 1779 in New Lotts, L. I., NY, daughter of JOHN LEGGETT and SARAH ALSOP. She was born 23 Jul 1758 in West Farms, Westchester Co., NY, and died 23 Jan 1848 in Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ.

Notes for ABNER EVERITT:

Abner Everitt's Revolutionary War pension file states Abner was a Lieutenant in Captain Jaynes's Company of Colonel Joseph Hart's Regiment of Bucks and Northampton Counties, PA. It became the "Battalion of the Flying Camp." The file states that "Abner Everitt was taken a prisoner at the surrender of Fort Washington the 16 November 1776 and continued prisoner until the 26 January 1781." The file refers to a journal written during the imprisonment describing "the sufferings that the said Abner Everitt and his fellow prisoners endured, the reading the account of which will be appalling to the most obdurate heart" (File W6087).

(A monument to honor the defenders of Fort Washington was not erected until 1901. A champion for such a monument was Chauncey M. Depew, President of the Empire State Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, who, in a letter dated 1897 to the Mayor of New York City, argued for the building of a memorial at Fort Washington, so that those who pass the place will not do so "in ignorance of the spot most deeply stained with the blood of our patriotic ancestors." Chauncey, in his account to the Mayor of the surrender of Fort Washington, writes that the Americans "surrendered 3,000 prisoners of war to languish in British dungeons or perish on British prison-ships. The Hessian mercenaries of the British, enraged by the desperate resistance which they had encountered, violated the laws of humanity and civilized warfare by wreaking their vengeance in a horrible butchery of their helpless captives; while Washington, contemplating the scene from a distance, wept like a child at the fate of his heroic companions-in-arms, which he was powerless to avert" (quoted in Hall and Gazzam's 1902 "Fort Washington," pp.7-8).)

An important source of information for Abner and Susannah Everitt is a copy of a family Bible dated 1831. The Bible reads: "Presented by her Grandmother / Susannah D[L]eggett Everitt / March 26, 1844 / To / Susan Everitt Stuart." The Bible offers birth and death dates for Abner and Susannah's children, and for Israel and Susan Harris's children.

Notes for SUSANNAH LEGGETT:

The 1865 "Narrative of Major Abraham Leggett of the Army of the Revolution: With an Introduction and Notes by Charles I. Bushnell" contains the following entry:

Susannah Leggett was the daughter of John Leggett, of West Farms, by his wife Sarah, and was born in Westchester County, N. Y., on the 23d day of July, 1758. She was married on the 3d day of February, 1779, to Abner Everitt, of Pennsylvania, who was by occupation a farmer. She died in Belvidere, N. J., on the 23d day of January, 1848, in the 90th year of her age. Her husband died in Pennsylvania on the 3d day of August, 1794, at the age of 40 years and six months. They had nine children, of whom there were four sons and five daughters. Abner Everitt was an officer in the army of the Revolution, and was at one time a prisoner with the enemy. There is a portrait of Mrs. Everitt, taken in her old age, and said to be an excellent likeness, in possession of her daughter, Mrs. John O. Van Allen, of this city.

The same information is found in Theodore Augustus Leggett's 1913 "Early Settlers of West Farms, Westchester County, N. Y. (pp.41-42, 52).

The Revolutionary War pension papers for Abner Everitt state that on 25 Aug 1837 Susannah Everitt, a resident of Belvidere, appeared before the Warren Co., NJ Superior Court of Common Pleas. The papers indicate she married Abner Everitt at New Lotts, Long Island on 3 Feb 1779. The papers also state: "And that she was afterwards married to one Robert Smith in the City of New York and a short time afterwards the said Smith and her parted by mutual consent about forty years ago, and he the said Robert Smith has not been seen by her since that time neither has she received any assistance by or through him since they parted as man + wife, and has understood and believes that he died upwards of thirty years ago in the City of New Orleans. She has from the time of her separation from said Smith renounced his name and resumed the name of Everitt and continues to be called by that name ever since." The "New York Genealogical and Biographical Record" of 1882 lists the marriage of Susannah Everet to Robert Smith in 1796 in New York City, New York, NY [Marriage ID: 2220329279] (p.88).

5. WILLIAM⁴ EVERITT (*ASA*³, *MOSES*², *JOHN*¹) was born 17 Sep 1780 in Upper Mt. Bethel Twp., Northampton Co., PA. He married ANNA VAN SICKLE.

Notes for WILLIAM EVERITT:

William Everitt appears with Joseph Everitt on the 1810 Upper Mt. Bethel, Northampton Twp., PA census. The 1820 Upper Mt. Bethel census lists families alphabetically, and shows Epenetres [Epenetus], Moses, William, James, and Joseph Everitt.

In his 1914 "A History of Delaware County, Pennsylvania, and Its People," John Woolf Jordan writes that William Mack was born in Mt. Bethel, Northampton Co., PA, and married Rachel Everett, "daughter of William and Anna (Van Sickle) Everett and granddaughter of Asa and Sarah Everett."

Assuming that the Asa and Sarah Everett mentioned by Jordan were actually Asa and Margaret Everitt, the information for William Everitt's daughter, Rachel, and her husband, William Mack, has been tentatively entered here.

6. ELISHA⁴ EVERITT (*ASA*³, *MOSES*², *JOHN*¹) was born 09 Jul 1775 in Upper Mt. Bethel Twp., Northampton Co., PA, and died 05 Nov 1852 in Clinton Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ. He married MARGARET GASTON, daughter of WILLIAM GASTON and ELIZABETH SIMONTON. She was born 19 Jul 1780 in Upper Mt. Bethel Twp., Northampton Co., PA, and died 25 Jan 1861 in Clinton Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ.

Notes for ELISHA EVERITT:

Elisha Everitt's birth date has been calculated from his tombstone inscription, which states he died 5 Nov 1852 at age 77y3m27d.

Several Hunterdon Co., NJ deeds show Elisha and Margaret Everitt engaged in property purchase or sale. A deed dated 12 Apr 1817 records the sale of land by Philip and Hannah Grandin, Jr. of Lebanon Twp. to Elisha Everitt of Mount Bethel Twp., Northampton Co., PA (Bk.27, p.374). In Feb of 1832, Elisha Everitt and Andrew Kinney, acting as executors of the late John Van Fleet, were engaged in the sale of land in Lebanon Twp. (Bk.52, p.494; Bk.67, p.386). Another deed, dated 1846, indicates Elisha and Margaret Everitt of Clinton Twp. sold

property to Albert Williams. The land began on "the great road leading from Clinton to Flemington" and located near property of James Hedden, William L. King, and Alexander Probasco (Bk.86, p.96). On 9 Apr 1851, Elisha and Margaret Everitt sold Clinton Twp. property to John T. Leigh, land near property sold by David Miller and John A. Weart (Bk.97, p.333). Then, on 1 Apr 1853, Margaret Everitt, widow of Elisha Everitt, conveyed her dower and all other rights and interests in her husband's farm to executors Charles G. Everitt and David W. Cramer. The farm was adjacent to land of John Grandin, Henry Aller, Tunis Smith, and others, and contained 118 acres (Bk.104, p.143). On the same day, Charles and David then sold the land to Henry McCloughan (Bk.105, p.235).

Elisha Everitt appears on the 1800 and 1810 Upper Mt. Bethel, Northampton Co., PA censuses. His next appearance is on the 1830 Lebanon Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ census. In 1841, Clinton Twp. was formed from Lebanon Twp., and the 1840 Clinton Twp. census lists both Elisha Everitt and his son, John A. Everitt. In 1850, Elisha and Margaret Evert appear in Clinton Twp. with Mases Cline, Charles Cline, and Henry M. Cline. The 1860 Clinton Twp. census lists 79 year-old Margaret Everitt and 26 year-old Charles Kline.

Elisha Everitt's Last Will and Testament, written 6 Apr 1845 and proved 18 Nov 1852, places him in Clinton Twp. and identifies his wife as Margaret; his sons as John A., Asa, and Charles G.; and, his daughters as Elizabeth (wife of David W. Cramer) and Masse Kline (wife of Manuel Kline, deceased). Masse's children are identified as Charles Kline and Henry Montgomery Kline. Also listed is Elisha's deceased daughter, Sallean Kline, his son-in-law David M. Kline Jr., and Sallean Kline's four children: Margaret Kline, John Kline, Sallean Kline, and Annemariah Hy___? Kline (Bk.9, p.183). (David M. Kline Jr. married Elisha and Margaret Everitt's daughter, Sally Ann, who died 10 Oct 1844.)

Hunterdon Co. Guardianship records indicate that in 1828, upon the renunciation of Amelia Briggs, widow of Josiah Briggs, Elisha Everitt became guardian of Amelia's children, John, James, and Henry Briggs, all under 14 years of age (File 130). The 1830 Lebanon Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ census lists Amelia Briggs near Elisha Everitt. The 1850 Franklin Twp., Hunterdon Co. census shows 71 year-old Amelia Briggs, who was born in PA, living with Philip and Elizabeth Shafer, who had a daughter, Amelia Ann.

Notes for MARGARET GASTON:

According to a Genforum posting by Richard Wood, who did research at the Easton, PA courthouse, Margaret Gaston was the daughter of William and Elizabeth Gaston. Wood states that William (1742-1801) married Elizabeth Simonton and had five children: Alexander, William, Charles, Margaret, and Elizabeth. Margaret's brother, William, married Lydia and had four children: Elizabeth, William Isaac, Abraham, and Charles.

The 1850 Lower Mt. Bethel, Northampton Co., PA census shows Margaret (Gaston) Everitt's brother, William Gaston, and his wife, Lydia, living with his son, William Isaac Gaston, and, presumably, William Isaac's daughter, Margaret. Elisha and Margaret Everitt were in Clinton Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ in 1850.

9. ZENAS⁴ EVERITT (*ZENAS*³, *MOSES*², *JOHN*¹) was born 20 Mar 1777, and died 12 Dec 1846 in Hope Twp., Warren Co., NJ. He married CATHARINE PARR 03 Apr 1803. She was born 15 Sep 1786, and died 16 Apr 1841 in Hope Twp., Warren Co., NJ.

Notes for ZENAS EVERITT:

The 1830 Knowlton Twp., Warren Co., NJ census lists Zenas Everett, whose household included 1M 0-5, 1M 10-15, 1M 15-20, 1M 40-50, 1F 5-10, 1F 15-20, 1F 20-30, and 1F 40-50. The 1840 Hope Twp., Warren Co. census lists Zenas an Enos Everet, and the household contained 1M 10-15, 1M 20-30, 1M 60-70, 1F 5-10, 1F 15-20, 1F 20-30, and 1F 50-60. So far, five of Zenas and Catharine's children are known: Ann, Zenas, and Epenetus, Abner, and Rachel. (The last two children are mentioned in a letter written by Zenas Everitt, notes from which were kindly supplied by Kenneth Everett.) Another son may have been William Everitt, born about 1820, who is found on census records living with Zenas and Catharine's son, Zenas. William is tentatively entered here as Zenas and Catharine's son. (In a letter dated 31 Jan 1912, Oscar S. Everitt, writing about his ancestry, refers to his "uncle William Everett." There is no evidence of such an uncle, but if Oscar S. Everitt meant a great-uncle, then William could have been Zenas and Catharine's son. In another letter, Oscar S. Everitt refers to "my uncle Moses" when he seems to mean his grandfather Wesley Everitt's uncle.)

Zenas Everitt died intestate, and administration of his estate was granted to Zenas W. Everitt. An inventory of Zenas's estate was completed 2 Jan 1847 by Zenas W. Everitt, David D. Shannon, and Frank Dernberger (805U).

Zenas Everitt's tombstone states he died 12 Dec 1846 at age 69y8m22d.

10. JOHN L.⁴ EVERITT (*ABNER*³, *MOSES*², *JOHN*¹) was born 04 Nov 1781 in NY, and died 14 Dec 1836. He married MARY KING 1807 in New York City, New York, NY. She was born 05 Jan 1787, and died 16 Jun 1868 in New York City, New York, NY.

Notes for JOHN L. EVERITT:

The history of descendants for John L. Everitt entered here is tentative, based as it is on circumstantial evidence such as census reports. That the John L. Everitt entered here was Abner and Susannah (Leggett) Everitt's son, however, is supported by the fact that John L. Everitt had a great-grandson named John Leggitt Everitt.

Other evidence exists. For instance, on 29 Mar 1838 Moses Everitt, brother of Abner Everitt, wrote a codicil to his Last Will and Testament that refers to Abner Everitt's daughters, Hannah McCracken and Elizabeth Stuart, and to "the widow of John Everitt, son of Abner, now living in the city of New York" (#4805). Also, Susannah (Leggett) Everitt owned a family Bible that states her son, John L. Everitt, was born 4 Nov 1781 and died 14 Dec 1836. Her son, therefore, could be the "late John L. Everitt" referred to in the 1868 death notice of his wife, Mary.

Susannah (Leggett) Everitt married Robert Smith in 1796 in New York City but soon parted. While in New York City, Susannah's children, the oldest of whom was born 1780, probably lived with her there. Although Susannah was back in Belvidere by 1837, her daughter Mary (Everitt) Van Allen and son John L. Everitt seem to have remained in NY.

The "New York Genealogical and Biographical Record" of 1884 lists the marriage of John L. Everett to Mary King in 1807 in New York City, New York, NY [Marriage ID: 2220297962] (p.136). Given the birth years of John and Mary Everitt's children, it is assumed this 1807 marriage is for Abner and Susannah's son.

Notes for MARY KING:

The 17 Jun 1868 "New York Times" noted the death on 16 Jun 1868 of Mrs. Mary Everitt, "widow of the late John L. Everitt, aged 81 years, 5 months and 11 days." The notice identifies her sons as Cornelius L., John L., and George W. Everitt (p.5). Based on this information, Mary Everitt would have been born 5 Jan 1787.

Notes for MARY EVERITT:

The 1850 New York, NY census lists 72 year-old John C. and 66 year-old Mary Van Allen. Living with them were 32 year-old William C. and 30 year-old Charles C. The census-taker indicates John was born in NJ and Mary in PA. William and Charles were born in NY. It is not certain William and Charles were sons of John and Mary, but are tentatively entered here as such. The family has not been found on later censuses. However, the 1860 New York, NY census lists an 83 year-old Ann Van Allen, born NJ, lodging at the Ladies Union and Society for the Care of the Aged and Infirm. Ann might be Mary (Everitt) Van Allen. By 1870, William and Rachel had moved to Tunkhannock, Wyoming Co., PA, appearing there on the 1870 and 1880 censuses.

Notes for WILLIAM MACK:

John Woolf Jordan, writing of William Mack in "A History of Delaware County, Pennsylvania," states that William's father, William Mack, Sr., "owned a farm on the Pennsylvania side of the Delaware river, opposite Belorden, New Jersey, and an island in the river known as Mack's Island. He married Rachel Gulick, whose father was proprietor of a hotel near Winchester, Virginia." William Mack, Jr. was born in Mount Bethel, Northampton Twp., PA and settled in Richmond, PA, "where he was engaged in business as a carriage builder," and married Rachel Everett in Easton, PA. Jordan adds that William Mack was a carriage maker and that he died in Tunkhannock, PA (p.717). Jordan identifies William and Rachel Mack's children, and his information has been used here.

The land was south of the village of Clinton (Bk.14, P.159). Then, on 23 Oct 1843, John A. and Zebiah Everitt of Clinton Twp. sold the same land to Elisha Everitt, also of Clinton Twp. (Bk.81, p.16).

John A. Everitt appears on the 1840 Lebanon Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ census with a household including four males 5-30 years old, and one female 5-10 years old. John and his wife were 30-40. The 1860 Phillipsburg, Warren Co., NJ census lists John A. and Lizebia Everitt with 18 year-old daughter, Mercy. John's occupation is recorded as a bridge builder. John and Zilbiah have not been found on other census records.

David W. Cramer's Last Will and Testament, written 8 Mar 1862 and proved 24 Oct 1862, places David in

Clinton Twp. and identifies his parents as Matthias (deceased) and Christian Cramer; his wife as Elisabeth; and his five children as Andrew Jackson Cramer, Christian McPherson (wife of John L. McPherson), Theodore Cramer, Manuel Cramer, and Ennis Cramer (Bk.10, p.587).

The 2 Sep 1868 "Hunterdon County Democrat" noted: "Death of an Aged Lady: Christiana Cramer, widow of the late Mathias Cramer, died at her residence in Clinton township, on the 14th of August last, at the advanced age of 92 years, 4 months and 25 days. She left 8 children, by whom she had 36 grand-children, 49 great-grand-children, and 3 great-great-grand-children."

The 11 Feb 1852 "Hunterdon County Democrat" announced the following marriage: "On Thursday evening, Jan 29th, by the Rev. John Steel, Mr. Andrew J. Cramer, to Miss Adeline Fulkerson, both of Clinton."

Andrew J. and Emily A. Cramer are found on the 1860 Clinton Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ census with three children: Francis, Catharine, and Howard. The family lived near 60 year-old John Fulkerson. The 1870 Clinton Twp. census shows Jackson and Adalaid Cramer with Frank (17 years old, presumably daughter Francis) and H. Edgar. Living near the family were Emanuel and Anna J. Cramer. By 1900, Emily A. Cramer was a 70 year-old widow. Living with her in Clinton Twp. was 67 year-old widow, Anna E. Yawger, a nurse. They lived next to a Mathias and Norma Cramer.

Andrew J. Cramer's Last Will and Testament, written 13 Jan 1897 and proved 9 Feb 1897, places Andrew in Clinton Twp. and identifies his wife as Emily A. Cramer, his daughter as Francis A. Wyckoff (wife of James Wyckoff), and his son as Howard E. Cramer (Bk.18, p.569). The document also states Andrew J. Cramer died 25 Jan 1897.

A John and Christian McPherson appear on the 1860 Elizabeth, Union Co., NJ census with four children, the oldest of whom was 7 years old. The census states John McPherson was a railroad conductor. Assuming this Christian was the daughter of David and Elizabeth Cramer, the census data have been entered here. The family appears on the 1870 Union Twp., Bergen Co., NJ census, where John McPherson is listed as a hotel keeper. A fifth child, Hannah, is listed with the family.

The family has not been located on later censuses.

With the exception of the 1870 census, Theodore and Catharine Cramer are found from 1860 to 1910 in Clinton Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ. The 1870 census places them in Readington Twp. In 1860 and 1870, a daughter, Janthe (or Lanthe), is listed with Theodore and Catharine. The 1900 census-taker states Catharine had had no children, but the 1910 census-taker indicates she had had one child who was not alive.

Although no other documents have been found to verify this marriage, the 1870 Clinton Twp. census lists Emanuel and Anna J. Cramer. Emanuel was 34 years old, and therefore the same age as David W. Cramer's son. In 1870, Emanuel and Anna had a son, Charles A. Also living with the family was 20 year-old Lewis Hockenbury. Emanuel and Anna lived near Jackson and Adalaid Cramer. The 1880 Clinton Twp. census lists Manuel and Anna J. Cramer with four children: Charles A., John O., George W., and Sarah A. Also listed is a 14 year-old Susan Cramer, identified as a servant. By 1900, Manuel and Anna J. had moved to Flemington, Hunterdon Co., and appear with daughter Anna M., who was born Jan 1889. The 1910 Flemington census shows Emanuel and Anna J. Cramer with son G. W. Cramer, and daughter and son-in-law Annie M. and Harry Anderson.

The "Genealogical Magazine of N.J." lists entries from the Kline family Bible, including information about David M. Kline, Jr. and Sarah Ann Kline, whom the Bible identifies as the daughter of Elisha and Margaretta Everitt. (Vol. II, pp.800-801). After Sarah's death, David remarried Lydia H. Roberson on 19 Oct 1846.

Tiger is last seen on the 1910 Walnut Grove Twp. census living with Newton and Stella Swisher, and their son, John. Margaretta is identified as a 77 year-old widow and mother-in-law of Newton Swisher.

Notes for ASA J. TIGER:

Asa Tiger's birth date has been calculated from the Kline family Bible entry, which states Asa died 25 Oct 1909 at age 84y11d. The 1850 Tewksbury Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ census lists a 24 year-old Asa Tiger with the family of George A. and Maria Tiger. It is uncertain this was the Asa Tiger who married Margaretta Kline. Some sources state the Asa Tiger who married Margaretta Kline was the son of Jacob Tiger and Mary Henn Cramer.

The 28 Sep 1853 "Hunterdon County Democrat" noted: "Married: At Clinton, Sept. 20th, by Rev. Mr. Van Amburg, Benjamin Yawger, to Mrs. Mercy Kline." The 1870 Canton, Fulton Co., IL census shows a 59 year-old Mercy Youger living with the family of Henry Kline, Manuel and Mercy (Everitt) Kline's son.

Illinois marriage records, however, date the marriage as 12 Jun 1863.

The 1860 census for Canton lists 26 year-old Henry Kline, a merchant who was born in NJ. Henry M. and Lucy Kline are found on the 1870 and 1880 Canton censuses. By 1880, they had four children: Edward E., Charles H., John W., and William S. The 1900 Canton census shows Henry M. Klein, a 66 year-old widower, whom the census-taker states was born in NJ on July 1833, living with his son and daughter-in-law, John W. and Cora Klein.

Henry M. Kline moved to Chicago, Cook Co., IL, appearing there on the 1910 census remarried to Maria J. The census-taker indicates this was Henry's second marriage and Maria's third. They had been married six years. The 1920 Chicago census lists Henry M. Kline as an 87 year-old widower.

The Cook County Death Index lists the 7 Jun 1920 death of Henry Montgomery Kline.

Bethel census shows 51 year-old Zenas W. Everitt with Eliza A. (16) and Zenas W. (13), and William Everitt (40). In 1870, Z. Wesley Everitt (62) and Zenus W. (23) are listed in Mt. Bethel Twp. Living with them was 50 year-old house keeper, Sarah Hill. Zenas W. Everitt, a 71 year-old widower, appears on the 1880 Williamsburg, Northampton Co., PA census. Living with him were his son and daughter-in-law, Zenas W. and Matilda Everitt, and their children, Franklin G. and Oscar S.

Oscar S. Everitt wrote a letter in which he refers to his "Grandpa Wesley Everitt" who "settled on the old farm across Dopkee Island on the hill," and also writes, "My father had 2 sisters, Aunt Lizzie and Eliza. Aunt

Lizzie married J. T. Colter of Easton, and Eliza married Daniel Butts. One brother died young." Census records show two daughters, Catharine and Eliza. An IGI posting at the LDS site states Catherine Elizabeth Everitt married Joseph F. Crater on 19 Jan 1856 in Warren Co., NJ. Census reports validate this posting, showing Joseph and Catherine and their children in Easton, Northampton Co., PA. One of their sons, William E. Crater, married and had a son, William Everett Crater.

The marriage date for Catherine Everitt and Joseph Crater comes from an IGI posting at the LDS site. Although the posting states they were married in Warren Co., NJ, no NJ marriage record for them has been found. Perhaps the marriage actually occurred in Northampton Co., PA, though the family is found on the 1860 census in Hackettstown, Warren Co., NJ. By 1870, Joseph and Catherine moved to Easton, and are found there on the 1870 and 1880 censuses.

Catherine may have died before 1892, for an IGI posting states Joseph Crater remarried in 1892. The 1900 Easton, Northampton Co., NJ census shows Jos. Crater married to a Mary W., who was born Nov 1851. (Joseph's son, Jos. K., lived with Joseph and Mary.)

Other IGI postings offer details for Joseph and Catherine Crater's children. Since the details are consistent with census records and other sources, the IGI information has been entered here as reliable.

An IGI posting at the LDS site states Joseph Force Crater's second marriage was to Mary W. Keller on 14 Jan 1892 in Northampton Co., PA.

Zenas W. Everitt's death certificate states Zenas was born 9 Aug 1846, the son of Zenas Wesley Everitt, and died a widower on 30 Sep 1925 at age 79y1m21d in Harmony Twp., Warren Co., NJ. The informant for the certificate was Frank Everitt of Blairstown, NJ.

Epenetus Everitt and his first wife, Alenah, appear on the 1850 Knowlton Twp., Warren Co., NJ census with two children, John C. A. and Margret Maria. The 1860 and 1870 censuses place them in Hope Twp., Warren Co. Five children appear in 1860 and six in 1870 (Margret was absent in 1870). Epenetus and his second wife, Susan, are listed on the 1880 Hope Twp. census with 10 year-old Emma Huff, identified as Epenetus's step-daughter, and 24 year-old son Theodore.

In 1900, Susan Everitt, a 62 year-old widow, appears on the Hope Twp. census.

He married (1) SUSAN FREDERICA GRAFF 27 Feb 1836 in New York City, New York, NY. He married (2) MARY ANN PENTZ 24 Apr 1849 in New York City, New York, NY. She was born Abt. 1826.

Notes for CORNELIUS L. EVERITT:

The following is an entry from Rev. Henry Griswold Jesup's 1887 "Edward Jessup of West Farms, Westchester Co., New York and his Descendants":

Benjamin Jesup (Blackleach, ^ Edward ^ Edward, ^ Edward'^^, born in Wilton, 19 May, 1766; married Mary M. Styer, of New York city. He was a boot and shoe dealer in the city, and died there, 1 Jan., 1842. His will is dated 21 July, 1832; proven 31 Jan., 1842. The citation issued by the court, 10 Dec. previous, enumerates by name all the next of kin connected with his father's family to the number of twenty, much to the aid of the genealogist who is looking up the family history.

His wife died about 1854. Her will is dated 11 Sept., 1849; proven, 19 Oct., 1854. She directs the Protestant Episcopal service to be read at her funeral. "Uncle Benjamin" and "Aunt Mary" were held in high esteem by their numerous nephews and nieces, who still remember their abundant hospitality and kindly interest in them all.

Having no children they adopted a niece of Mrs. Jesup, —

129. Elizabeth, who m. John G. Pentz, of New York city, and had two children:

1. Benjamin Jesup Pentz, long since dead;

2. Mary Ann Pentz, who m. Cornelius Everitt of the same city. She d. some years since, and Mr. Everitt d. in 1875. His will distributes his estate among his brothers and sisters, showing he had no children. At the time of his death he was Secretary of the New York Gas Light Company.

The "New York Genealogical and Biographical Record" of 1884 lists the marriage of Cornelius L. Everitt to Mary Ann Pentz on 24 Apr 1849 in New York City, New York, NY [Marriage ID: 2220308293]. Apparently, Cornelius had been previously married, for the same source's 1932 quarterly shows that a Cornelius L. Everitt married Susan Frederica Graff on 27 Feb 1836 in New York City [Marriage ID: 2220308288]. The 1840 New York, NY census lists Cors. L. Everitt, whose household included 1M 0-5, 1M 15-20, 1M 20-30, 1F 15-20, 2F 20-30, and 1F 50-60. (The 1840 household seems to include two families. Since Cornelius's brothers do not appear on the 1840 census, one of them may have been living with Cornelius.) The 1850 New York, NY census lists Cornelius T. Everett. Living with Cornelius were 24 year-old Mary A. Everitt, 12 year-old John G. Everitt, 52 year-old Elizabeth Pentz, and 82 year-old Mary M. Jesup. According to Rev. Jesup, Cornelius and Mary "had no children," since none were mentioned in Cornelius's will. The 12 year-old John G. Everitt living with Cornelius in 1850 is probably the 1M 0-5 of the 1840 census, and therefore the son of Cornelius and Susan (Graff) Everitt. (A John George Everitt died 8 Mar 1860, and was probably Cornelius's son, who makes no later census appearances.)

The 1860 New York, NY census lists C. L. Everett (51), Ann E. Everitt (71), Emeline Everitt (42), and Mary Everitt (39). Ann E. is surely Cornelius's mother, who was born 1787 and died 1868. Emeline was Cornelius's sister, who is also seen with Cornelius on the 1870 census.

These census reports indicate Cornelius worked for the Gas Company.

Emmons Clark's 1890 "History of the Seventh Regiment of New York: 1806-1889" states that at the request of the military Cornelius L. Everitt, "secretary of the Second Regiment, in later years the President of the New York Gas Company," wrote a petition on 17 Oct 1837 that was sent to the mayor of New York City. Since the Twenty-seventh Regiment often assisted the city in the 1830s in suppressing "mob violence, and in the preservation of peace and order," the Regiment expected that the city would help the military by supplying drill-rooms. When such help did not occur, it was decided to petition the mayor. Cornelius's petition, quoted by Clark, asked the mayor of New York City for "consideration of the propriety of providing a military hall, with suitable accommodations for drills and meetings for improvement in tactics and discipline." Part of Cornelius's argument was that the military often assisted the city in the "preservation of the peace of the city, and to protect public and private property." Thus, a military meeting hall would be better than "collecting in a public manner, thereby causing undue excitement" when the city called upon the military for help. Clark writes: "Thus originated a movement which secured the militia of New York the use of Centre Market for military purposes, and established a precedent by which the Seventh Regiment obtained in 1860 commodious military accommodations, and other city regiments subsequently secured the suitable armories at the public expense" (pp.258-259).

(For other researchers looking for Charles H., it should be noted that another Charles H. Everitt born about 1836 lived in Queens, NY. The "New York Genealogical and Biographical Record" of 1922 lists the marriage of a Charles H. Everitt to Libby Ludlum in 1861 in Hempstead, Queens, NY [Marriage ID: 2220294723] (p.381). He may, though, have been the son of a John and Ann Everitt of Hempstead. Census records for Hempstead show a 50-60 year-old William Everitt, and after him, a 20-30 year-old John Everitt. John's wife was also 20-30, and they had a son 0-5 years old. The 1850 Hempstead census lists a 36 year-old Ann Everitt with 14 year-old Charles H. The same two appear on the 1860 Hempstead census. In 1870, Charles H. is married to Elizabeth L. and has three children: Ada, Frederick, and Ella. Ann Everitt, age 56, lived with the family. It is possible that John Everitt was William Everitt's son, that Ann was John's wife, and Charles H. his son. This Charles H. Everitt died 26 Jun 1878 and is buried in Greenfield Cemetery, Hempstead. His daughter, Ada, and son, Frederick, are also buried at Greenfield.)

Everitt living with Derius and Clara Hoyt. NY death records list a Mrs. Lucy E. Everitt who died 23 Feb 1853. Lucy C. Hoyt is tentatively entered here as George W. Everitt's first wife, though substantiation is needed.

The 1860 New York City, NY census lists 35 year-old George and 25 year-old Mary Everitt, and their children, John L. and Mary. By 1870 the family had moved to Brooklyn, NY and another daughter, 9m-old Eva H., is listed. Still in Brooklyn in 1880, George W. and Mary H. Everitt had three more children, Jessie C., Blanche, and Georgie M.

Also living with Mary H. Everitt in 1900 was a grandson, 12 year-old Edward Everitt. He was the son of John L. and Clara Everitt, George W. and Mary H. Everitt's son and daughter-in-law. After John's death, Clara remarried William Boyd in 1892. Edward's brothers lived with William and Clara Boyd in 1900.

Census records indicate George W. Everitt was a clerk in 1850, a bookbinder in 1860. Another George W. Everitt who was a Brooklyn bookbinder appears on census records. He was born about 1808 and was married to a Sarah. The family appears on the 1850 Brooklyn census. The 1857 "New York City Directory" lists him as George W. A. Everitt, a bookbinder at 230 Pearl St., whose home was in Brooklyn. By 1860, this family moved to Gaines, Orleans Co., NY. (Among George and Sarah's children was a son, Cornelius C. Everitt.) It could be argued that John L. and Mary Everitt's son, George W., was the George born 1808 and married to Sarah. However, since the George W. Everitt who married Mary McKeel had a son named John L. Everitt, and a grandson named John Leggit Everitt, it is this George, born about 1825, who is entered here as John L. and Mary Everitt's son, though the need for substantiation is acknowledged.

Notes for MARY H. MCKEEL:

The 1850 Nelsonville, Putnam Co., NY census shows 11 year-old Mary H. McKeel with her parents, John and Hannah McKeel. Among Mary's listed siblings was 12 year-old Elisabeth McKeel. The two are absent from John McKeel's family in 1860.

Beginning in 1870, Elizabeth McKeel lived with her sister, Mary H. Everitt. The 1870 Brooklyn census lists 30 year-old Elizabeth Mekiel with George W. and Mary H. Everett, and the 1880 Brooklyn census lists her as 41 year-old Lizzie McKeel, identified as a sister. Lizzie McKeel also appears on the 1900 census at age 56 living with widowed Mary H. Everitt and is again identified as a sister.

25. SUSAN EVERITT⁵ STUART (*ELIZA LAWRENCE⁴ EVERITT, ABNER³, MOSES², JOHN¹*) was born 25 Jan 1825 in Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ, and died 19 Aug 1894. She married ISRAEL HARRIS 14 Sep 1847 in Warren Co., NJ (Rev. Edward Atlaw). He was born Abt. 1821 in NJ.

Notes for SUSAN EVERITT STUART:

Israel and Susan Harris, and their children, appear on Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ censuses from 1850 to 1880.

Notes for ISRAEL HARRIS:

In his 1881 "History of Sussex and Warren Counties, New Jersey," James P. Snell writes of the Belvidere Bank, and states that John Stuart was elected cashier on 7 Apr 1831 and continued in that position until 1 Apr 1854. Snell then writes that "Israel Harris entered the bank in March, 1849; was teller and bookkeeper until Mr. Stuart's resignation, in 1854, when he was elected cashier, and has continued to discharge the duties in that capacity for twenty-seven years, and is still occupying the position" (p.545).

The 28 Sep 1848 "Warren Journal" noted the death of John Stuart Harris: "In this town on the 19th inst. John Stuart, infant son of Israel Harris, Esq."

Notes for HENRY SCHENCK HARRIS:

NJ marriage records list the marriage of Henry S. Harris to Martha Robinson in 1873 in Warren Co. (Bk.BM, p.824).

James P. Snell's 1881 "History of Sussex and Warren Counties, New Jersey" contains a biography of Henry S. Harris. Snell writes that Henry's grandfather was "Dr. Henry S. Harris, who for fifty years has been a prominent physician, most of which time he practised his profession in Warren Co., N. J." Henry's father was Israel Harris, who "was born June 8, 1820, in Readington, Hunterdon Co., N. J.; settled in Belvidere in 1845, and upon the resignation of John Stuart, the first cashier of the Belvidere Bank, he was chosen to fill the position, which place he has retained for a period of twenty-six years." Snell states that Israel Harris married "Susan, a daughter of John Stuart and Eliza Lawrence Everitt" and that the "children of Israel Harris are Henry S., Frank V., a student-at-law in the office of his brother, Henry S.; Charles E., a member of the junior class at Princeton in 1880; and Carrie A., wife of Dr. E. M. Beesley, of Belvidere" (pp.497-498). After discussing Henry S. Harris's professional life, Snell writes that "Mr. Harris married, Aug. 19, 1874, Miss Martha, a daughter of Anthony B. Robeson, deceased, of Belvidere. They have one child, Bertha Robeson, aged four years and six months" (p.498).

The 28 June 1881 "Hunterdon County Democrat" reported that "Dr. Henry S. Harris, father of I. Harris, Esq., cashier of the Belvidere national bank, and grandfather of congressman Henry S. Harris, died at his residence, in Belvidere, on Tuesday noon, aged eighty five years six months and fifteen days." NJ death records list

Henry S. Harris who died at age 85y 6m in Belvidere, Warren Co. on 2 Jun 1881 (1880-81. 95 - H26). Henry S. and Martha R. Harris, and daughters Bertha and Susan E., appear on the 1880 Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ census living with Henry's parents, Israel and Susan E. Harris. The 1895 and 1900 Belvidere censuses reveal that Henry's wife, Martha, died before 1895. In 1895, Henry is seen with daughter Roberta [Bertha] R., and in 1900, Henry, a 49 year-old widower, is also seen with daughter Roberta R. Census reports identify Henry as a lawyer.

Several sources offer information concerning the professional life of Henry S. Harris.

The "Biographical Directory of the United States Congress" contains the following: "HARRIS, Henry Schenck, a Representative from New Jersey; born in Belvidere, Warren County, N.J., December 27, 1850; attended the common schools and was graduated from Princeton College in 1870; studied law; was admitted to the bar in 1873 and commenced practice in Belvidere, N.J.; appointed prosecutor of the pleas for Warren County in March 1877; elected as a Democrat to the Forty-seventh Congress (March 4, 1881-March 3, 1883); unsuccessful candidate for reelection in 1882 to the Forty-eighth Congress; resumed the practice of law; died in Belvidere, N.J., May 2, 1902; interment in Belvidere Cemetery."

The "Manual of the Legislature of New Jersey" contains the following: "Henry Schenck Harris: (Dem., Belvidere.) Mr. Harris was born at Belvidere, Warren county, New Jersey, December 27th, 1850, and is a son of Israel Harris, cashier of Belvidere National Bank. He entered the Sophomore class at Princeton College in June, 1867, at the age of sixteen, and graduated in 1870. Studied law with J. G. Shipman, Esq., at Belvidere, and was licensed an attorney in June, 1873, counsellor at June term, 1876, and began successful practice immediately.

"In March, 1877, he was appointed Prosecutor of the Pleas for Warren county, and during his term in this office, its business has been of an important and varied character. The railroad strikers of 1877, were, to the number of twenty, indicted in Warren county. In September, 1878, a large number of indictments were presented against the members of the celebrated 'Warren County Ring,' all of whom were officials of influence and prominence. The trials of these persons attracted national attention, and were successfully conducted; eleven of the defendants being sentenced to the State Prison, and one to the county jail — a remarkable result in contrast to the termination of the Tweed ring prosecutions, and others of like character.

"The flight of the then Clerk of the Board of Freeholders from the Warren county jail, and his re-capture forty-eight hours afterwards at Alexandria, Virginia, was one of the most remarkable occurrences of the prosecution.

"Mr. Harris was nominated by acclamation for representative in Congress, by the Fourth Congressional District Democratic Convention, held at Belvidere, September

8th, 1880. He made a most active canvass of the district, making speeches in every town and village, and was elected over Gen. Judson Kilpatrick, by a majority of 4173, notwithstanding the opposition of some of the members of the broken ring.

"Mr. Harris' paternal ancestors have resided in New Jersey over two hundred years. Dr. Isaac Harris, his great-great-grandfather, is buried at Pittstown, Salem county, N. J., and John Hart, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, was another progenitor.

"John Stuart, his maternal grandfather, was a Scotchman, who came to Warren county in 1811, and was many years cashier of the Belvidere Bank, till succeeded by the father of the subject of this sketch. Dr. Henry S. Harris, grandfather, for whom H. S. H. was named, practiced medicine for fifty-five years in the counties of Somerset, Hunterdon and Warren, and is still living, at the age of 86, at Belvidere" (pp.52-53).

Notes for MARTHA ROBESON:

The 1860 Hope Twp., Warren Co., NJ census shows 10 year-old Martha Robeson with her parents, Anthony and Ellen Robeson, and her siblings. In 1870, 20 year-old Martha lived with her widowed mother, Ellen, in Belvidere, Warren Co.

Notes for CAROLINE A. HARRIS:

Although Susannah Leggett Everitt's family Bible does not list Carrie A. Harris as a child of Israel and Susan Harris, 7 year-old Caroline appears with Israel and Susan on the 1860 census. She appears as 17 year-old Carrie A. on the 1870 census. Other sources identify Carrie A. as a daughter.

NJ marriage records list the marriage of E. M. Beesley to Carrie A. Harris in 1873 in Warren Co. (Bk.BM, p.824).

The 1880, 1895, and 1900 Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ censuses list Edward M. and Carrie A. Beesley and their children. Appearing on the same 1880 census page for Front St. are Carrie's parents, Israel and Susan Harris. The 1900 census-taker indicates Carrie had had five children, of whom three were still alive.

- iv. FRANKLIN VAN DEVER HARRIS, b. 28 Nov 1857, Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ; m. MARY ANNA BLACKFAN, 26 Apr 1882; b. 23 May 1858, Trenton, Mercer Co., NJ; d. 17 Feb 1905, Trenton, Mercer Co., NJ.

Notes for FRANKLIN VAN DEVER HARRIS:

The Trenton, NJ paper, "Daily True American," of 26 Apr 1882 noted the following marriage: "By Bishop Scarborough, assisted by Rev. W. H. Neilson, Jr., Frank V. Harris, of Belvidere, to Mary Anna, daughter of the late O. W. Blackfan."

The 1900 Washington, D.C. census lists Franklin and Mary A. Harris with daughter Mary A. The census-taker indicates Franklin, a lawyer for the Department of Justice, was born Nov 1857 in NJ and had been married 18 years.

The 1910 Richland Twp., Bucks Co., PA census lists a 52 year-old Franklin V. Harris, who was born in NJ, as were his parents, married to a 56 year-old Margaret K. The census-taker states they had been married three years and that this was the second marriage for both. Franklin is listed as a farmer. The same couple appears on the 1920 Philadelphia, PA census with two daughters, 21 year-old Rose and 16 year-old Louise, presumably Margaret's daughters from her first marriage. Franklin is listed as a detective. It is not yet certain this Franklin was Israel and Susan Harris's son.

Notes for MARY ANNA BLACKFAN:

Mary A. Blackfan is found on censuses for Trenton, Mercer Co., NJ from 1860 to 1880 living with her parents, Ogden W. and Mary Agnes Blackfan. (By 1880, Mary Agnes Blackfan was a widow.)

The 18 Feb 1905 "Trenton Times" carried an obituary for Mary A. Harris, and states that "Mrs. Mary Ann Harris, wife of Franklin V. Harris, and daughter of Mrs. O. W. Blackfan, died at her mother's home, 207 East State street, yesterday afternoon." The obituary states she "was well known in this city, but had resided in Belvidere for several years." Mary Ann "had been ill for some months, but was convalescent and came to visit her mother yesterday. Upon her arrival she had an attack of heart trouble, which resulted in her death."

The obituary states she was survived by her husband and one daughter (p.1).

The death certificate for Mary Anna Harris states Annie was the daughter of Ogden W. and Mary Agnes Blackfan, and that she died 17 Feb 1905 at age 47y at 207 East State St., Trenton, NJ.

Notes for CHARLES EVERITT HARRIS:

Charles and Bertie Harris appear on the 1895 Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ census residing at the Belvidere Hotel. In 1900, Charles E. and Bertha D. Harris, and daughter Susan S., are listed on the Belvidere census. The census-taker indicates Charles and Bertha had been married five years. Charles died before the 1910 census, for Bertha D. Harris appears on the Belvidere census as a 39 year-old widow with 12 year-old daughter Susan S. The two are also found on the 1920 Belvidere census.

26. MARY V.⁵ STUART (*ELIZA LAWRENCE⁴ EVERITT, ABNER³, MOSES², JOHN¹*) was born 18 Sep 1828 in Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ, and died 01 Mar 1859 in Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ. She married DAVID AYRES DEPUE 16 Dec 1850 in Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ, son of BENJAMIN DEPUE and ELIZABETH AYRES. He was born 27 Oct 1826 in Mt. Bethel Twp., Northampton Co., PA, and died 03 Apr 1902.

Notes for MARY V. STUART:

NJ marriage records list the marriage of David A. Depew to Mary Stuart on 16 Dec 1850 in Belvidere Warren Co. (Bk.AH, p.22).

More About MARY V. STUART:

Notes for DAVID AYRES DEPUE:

James P. Snell's 1881 "History of Sussex and Warren Counties, New Jersey" contains commentary regarding David Ayres Depue that states David "was born at Mount Bethel on the 27th of October, 1826" and that after studying with "the Rev. John Vanderveer, D.D., at Easton, Pa., he entered Princeton College in 1843, from which he graduated in the class of 1846." David then studied and practiced law in Belvidere, Warren Co., and "soon won a place in the front rank of his profession." Snell writes that in 1866 David "was appointed a justice of the Supreme Court of New Jersey by Governor Marcus L. Ward, and upon the expiration of his term, in 1873, was reappointed for a second term by Governor Joel Parker, and was again reappointed for a third term in 1880 by Governor George B. McClellan." Snell adds that when David was appointed to the bench, he moved from Belvidere to Newark, Essex Co., where he was residing when Snell wrote the commentary. Snell identifies

David's first wife as "Mary Van Allen, a daughter of John Stuart, a native of Scotland" and states that of this marriage "Judge Depue has one child living, Eliza Stuart Depue." David Depue's second wife was Delia A. Slocum, daughter of Oliver E. Slocum. Snell lists the children of this marriage as Sherrerd, Mary Stuart, and Frances Adelia (pp.493-494).

The 1850 Belvidere, Warren Co., NJ census shows 23 year-old David A. Depue, a lawyer, living with his parents, Benjamin and Elizabeth Depue, and his siblings. The 1860 Belvidere census lists David A. Depue with 7 year-old Eliza S., 62 year-old Eliza L. Stewart, and 40 year-old Ann Caroline Stewart. The family lived next to David's parents. By 1870, David had remarried and relocated to Newark, Essex Co., NJ, appearing on Newark censuses from 1870 to 1900.

On his passport application dated 14 Jun 1890, David A. Depue states he was born 27 Oct 1826 in Mount Bethel, PA, and resided in Newark, NJ. He further states he was married to Delia A. and was Justice of the Supreme Court of NJ.

The Internet site, "The Political Graveyard" lists: "Depue, David A. (c.1827-1902) — Associate justice of New Jersey state supreme court, 1889-1900; chief justice of New Jersey state supreme court, 1900. Died April 3, 1902. Burial location unknown."

A record of Belvidere Cemetery burials, however, lists William Stuart Depue, son of David A. and Mary Depue, and states William was born 3 Feb 1855 and died 18 Sep 1855. The same list assigns these dates to David and Mary's son, Edwin. Either the list is incorrect, or after William's death, David and Mary named a later son William Stuart, who was Edwin's twin. Both Williams are entered here.

She apparently traveled abroad with her father, whose passport application was dated 14 Jun 1890.
