

Richard Ashfords Andrew Johnston and John Roughhead have pursuant to the Directions of the said Act been appointed in their stead.

Now these do Certify that by my Lawfull Deputy Martin Rison with the Directions and consent of the said John Hamilton Richard Ashfords Andrew Johnston and John Roughhead the present Commissioners and Managers for the purposes in the said Act I have surveyed in one tract out of the unappropriated Lands of the General proprietors of the Eastern Division of New Jersey all that tract of Land lying and being in the county of Bergen Beginning at a white oak tree for a Corner standing upon the bank on the west side of that River which is said to come from Haverstar and esteemed to be the most northerly branch of Ronus Park River there being a hill called Spickon bog on the East side of the said River opposite to the said white oak tree and from thence running north Seventy five Degrees west thirty Eight chains to a maple tree for a Corner and from thence North forty five Degrees west fourteen chains to a hickory tree for a Corner thence South Seventy Degrees west twenty chains to a Chestnut tree for a corner and from thence South two shes chains to a Birch tree for a Corner and from thence South thirty Degrees west fifty chains to a Black oak tree for a Corner and from thence South twenty Degrees west twenty Eight chains to a Black oak sapling for a Corner and from thence South fifty five Degrees west two hundred and forty chains and from thence South thirty five Degrees East fifty two chains and from thence North fifty five Degrees East one hundred and sixty one chains and a half and from thence South forty two Degrees East one hundred and sixty seven chains and from thence North thirty seven Degrees East one hundred and fifty three chains and a half and from thence on a straight Line to the first mentioned white oak Corner being nearly north twenty three Degrees forty five minutes west one hundred and sixty seven chains containing after allowances for high ways four thousand acres of Land which Survey is made in order the better to enable the said John Hamilton Richard Ashfords Andrew Johnston and John Roughhead Commissioners or managers as aforesaid or the Major part or Survivor of them to sell and convey the said four thousand acres of Land pursuant to the Directions of and for the purposes in the said Act mentioned witness my hand the fifteenth day of April 1737

These do Certify that Alexander Mackdownall Deputy and sworn to his intent herein after mentioned did survey and lay out for Nicholas Lake of Middlesex County yeoman a certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the county of Middlesex aforesaid Beginning at a stake standing in the end of a tract of Land lately layd out for John Hamilton by forty chains South fifty four degrees East from the S. W. Corner (on the East side of Devils brook) of said tract from thence running South fifty four degrees East twenty eight chains and a half thence South twenty two chains thence North fifty two degrees west twenty nine chains thence North twenty one chains to the beginning containing after usual allowances fifty acres. To which the said Nicholas Lake hath Right by virtue of a deed of sale of one thousand acres of unappropriated Land from John Hamilton Esq bearing date the seventeenth day of March Anno Domini 1736 who is vested in one third part of a whole Propriety formerly James Craigs Deceased by several conveyances thereof remaining upon the publick Records of the province of East New Jersey which deed aforesaid from John Hamilton is recorded in Book E No. 2 page 21 - witness my hand this twelfth day of August 1738
