Fence - all my waring Apparal - and all my
beds and Bedding with the only residue as
above stated to Elizabeth Deats - my ~~fallard~~
of Cloathing - and all that may be in or upon
the same my Draper and all the furniture
there unto belonging to be Equally divided
amongst them.
