This fourth and twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord God one thousand
six hundred forty and nine, I John Lamb, the elder of London in the county of
Kent, yeoman being now in bed, but of sound and perfect memory, (being by God's
good make, and declared this my last will and testament in manner and form following,
that is to say, I first and above all things I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty
God my creator,stedfastly believing to have remission and forgiveness of all my sins
through the alone merits and merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour, and blessed redeemer
And my body I commit to the earth from whence it came to be, decently interred after
the manner of Christian buriall. And touching that portion of goods, and worldly estate
it hath pleased God to bless me with in this transitory life, I do will and dispose the
same as followeth, vizt. I give and bequeath unto the poor people of London
aforesaid fourty shillings Item I give unto my Sister, Elizabeth fourty shillings a year
during yeare to be paid her during her naturall life, at four times or terms of payment
in the yeare by even and equal portions Item I give unto Harb. Brouncker my said
Sister's sonne twenty shillings Item I give unto my Sister, Gardener's sonne twenty
shillings a piece Item I give unto my Sister, Amythes's sonne twenty shillings a piece till
the said severall legacies of twenty shillings to be paid within one yeare next after my
decease Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Mary fourty pounds to be
paid unto her within one yeare next after my decease Item I give unto Martha Pordage
and to Meade, Anne, and Jane, Sunders my daughter Mary's children twenty pounds
a piece to be paid unto them at their severall and respective ages of twentie yeares Item I
give and bequeath unto Marie, and of the daughters of my sonne Richard Lamb, deceased
one hundred pounds to be paid unto her at her age of one and twentie yeares Item I
give unto Elizabeth and other of the daughters of my said sonne Richard Lamb fifty pounds
to be paid unto her at her age of twentie yeares And my will is, that my executor shall pay
and allow unto the said Elizabeth eight pounds a yeare towards her maintenance
and education to be paid quarterly, vizt. yeare untill shes shall attaine the age aforesaid.
Item I give unto my loving brother, William Lamb fourty shillings, and to my loving
brother Richard Lamb twenty shillings, and to my sonne in law, Henrie Stanger
fourty shillings for a remembrance. And the residue of my goods and chattells
whatsoever my debts, and legacies being paid and fully expensed discharged, I do
will and bequeath unto my sonne John Lamb, whom I make and ordaine sole
Executor of this my last will and testament. And my will is, that my executor shall have
the manning and disposing of my late sonne in law, Thomas Pordage's
estate, and the tuition of his children according to the last will of the said Thomas
Pordage. And I do make and appointe my brother William Lamb, and my sonne
in law, Henrie Stanger overseers of this my last will and testament, desireing
them to be advised and assisted to my Executor the best they can. And this is
the

the last will of mine the said John Lake touching the disposition of my landes and
 tenements, that is to say first I will and devise all my landes and tenements with the
 appurtenances in Gorden aforesaid, and in Paratall Milton, also Middleton and
 Apard in the said countie of Kent unto my said sonne John Lake, and to his heirs
 for ever. Item I will and devise unto John Lake the some of my late sonne Richard
 my landes in Halesome in the sayd countie called Weop-ham, and the Salte thereunto
 belonning now in the occupation of Thomas Allen And also I will and devise
 unto the said John Lake of Richard still that messuages in Halesome aforesaid called Dunch
 Hill with the barnes stables and buildynges gardenes closes, and newesaid, and the garden
 and landes lyinge aboute the house, and one other parcell of land called Paytham
 late purchased of Mr. Pattinson, and conteyning in all aboute fowetyene or fiftene
 acres in Halesome aforesaid To have and to hold the said land, and tenements with
 their appurtenances unto the said John Lake the some of Richard, and to his heirs
 for ever at his age of one and twenty years And my will is, that my executor shall
 take and receive the rentes issues, and profitts of the said landes and tenements until
 the said John shall attaine his said age of one and twenty years payeing and allowyng
 unto the said John eight poundes a yeare toward his maintenance to be paid
 quarterly every yeare untill the said age aforesaid Item I will and devise unto Thomas Lake
 the some of my late sonne William Lake deceased the house and landes with the
 appurtenances in Halesome aforesaid now in the occupation of Thomas Wood, And also
 fowen parcell or parcells of land late purchased of the said Mr. Pattinson called
 Lomen, Paytonstrecte, Duff, Gounham meadow, and Regwood containinge aboute thirtene
 or fowetyene acres lyinge in Halesome aforesaid To have and to hold the said landes
 and tenements with their appurtenances unto the said Thomas Lake and his heirs
 for ever at his age of one and twenty years And my will is that my sonne in lawe Henry
 Stinner and his wife mother of the said Thomas shall take and receive the rentes
 issues and profitts of the said landes and tenements beforesaid even to the said Thomas
 toward the maintenance of herselfe the said Thomas, and her other children until
 the said Thomas shall attaine his said age aforesaid Item I will and bequeath unto Mary
 Lake the daughter of my sonne William Lake fiftie poundes to be paid unto her by
 my executor at her age of twenty years And lastly my will is that my executor
 shall paye unto the said John Lake the some of Richard one hundred poundes out
 of the rentes and profitts of the landes at Halesome aforesaid beforesaid even to the said
 John when hee the said John shall attaine his said age of one and twenty years
 And witness wherof I the said John Lake to this my present will conteynyng fowen
 leaves or sheets of paper, at the foot or bottom of each sheet I have subscribed
 my name, and on the top thereof by a Lattell have affixed my seale the daye and
 yeare first abovesaiden These marks of John Lake published sealed & delivered
 by the said Testator as his last will and testament in the presence of William Lake
 Thomas Seane, by his marks, and Ben. D. D.
