yeoman being in good health of body and of sound and perfect minde and memorye full humorously
and thanked be god unto almighty god for the same. Doe ordaine and make this my last will
and testament in manner and forme following. That is to say first I command my soul into the
merciful hands of almighty god my creator hoping and trusting through the mercies and
passion of our lord and saviour Jesu Christ my redeemer that after this mortall life ended I shall
inherit the kingdom of heaven in eternall felicitie. And I command my body to be buried after interr
in Christian burial when it shall please god to take me out of this mortall life. And as concerning

Item I give unto William Mawmire my god sonne the son of William Mawmire of Mapton ffor
willings I bid to the rest of the Children of the said William Mawmire of Mapton ffor said my pence
a piece Item I give unto Robert Mawmire and Joane Mawmire the sonne and daughters of the said
Elizabeth Dunne my Sister six pence a piece and unto the Children of the said Robert Mawmire and
Joane Mawmire six pence a piece Item I give unto the Children of William Mawmire and Joane Mawmire
the sonnes of the said Joane Mawmire six pence a piece Item I give unto Joane Sidford who
doth now live with me tene shillings Item I give and bequeath unto my kinsman Joane Sidford
who doth now live at Will Bishopps wtre Dainton the son of Joane Sidford who liveth now withoute
at Wells aforesaid the summe of thre pounds current English money to bee payd unto him within
one yere next ensuing after my deesse all which gifts and legacies before recited to bee by
me given my will and desire is shall be payd out of the money whiche is due unto me by bond
from my said Brother John Sidford after such tyme as my executrix therof in this my
said will nominate shall have received the said moneyes of the said John Sidford his executors
or attornys and not before Item all the rest and residue of my goods chattells chappell
of house and household stuffe whatsover I give and bequeath unto the said Joane Sidford who
doth now live with me at Wells aforesaid by what other name or title soever the said Joane is
or ought to bee called reputed or termed which said Joane Sidford the said Sylos Sidford doth
hereby nominate appoynt and make to bee the sole and sole executrix of this my said last
will and testament desiring her after this my mortall life ended to keepe and keepe my body to

To whom the administration was committed of all and singular the goods chattells and debts worth any manner of wayes concerne the Will of the said deceased. She being first lawfully sworn by virtue of a Commission in that behalfe well and truly to administer the same. Ex. 2.

Item I give and bequeath to my Linstowmone Marie Withridge two shillings to bee payd her within six monthes after my decease. All the rest of my goods and chattells debts and dutys belonging to me not formerly bequeathed and given I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth volume I do ordaine and by these presents make my sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said John Salt to this my last Will and Testament have set my hand and seale the fourteenth day of April in the year of our Lord God one thousand six hundred fiftie one. The signe of John Salt. In the presence of Samuell Sturmy Doctor of Littleham Matthew Flemyng.

This Will was proved att London before the Right Worshippull Sir Nathaniell Bentlif Knight Doctor of Law Master or Keeper of the Procurator Court the fourteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred fiftie and one by the Oath of Elizabeth the daughter and Executrix named in the said Will. To whom the administration of all and singular the goods chattells and debts of the said deceased which any manner of wayes concerne the said Will. She being first lawfully sworn by virtue of a Commission in that behalfe well and truly to administer the same. Ex. 2.

Memorandum that Evan Lewis late husbandman hett lived of Gutcombe in the County of Sommerset husbandman deceased being of perfect minde and memory and having no mindes purpose and desire to little and dispose of his estate did often tymes and more pertinently in the month of January in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred forty and nine by word of mouth other and declare his last Will and Testament Memorandum in these words recorded in effect following that is to say first he gave and bequeathed to John Lewis his Sonne one Cow shope and all his rocaring apparmell to his daughter Joane Lewis his gane one Cow shope to the three children of his sister Mithilian his gane Brodele and a pferde also his gane Marie the daughter of his Sister Bridgett Brodele his gane land to his Sister Sidwells daughter Cloude Dodridge Brodele þre þre and vñies of his goods chattells and debts unþorneath his gane and bequeathed onto Cloude Dodridge his wifem whom he made his wif and appointed to bee the sole Executrix of this his last Will and Testament till such time as or the like in effect and substance were by him spoken in the presence and hearing of þose witnesses to þose names and places written.
