 of our Lord God one thousand six hundred fiftie and eight by the oath of Christian Sausmond the Executor
 of the said deceased, and also Executrix therein named. In whose name was committed administration of all
 and singular the goods, chattels, and debts of the said deceased. To whom the said Christian the
 administration being first lawfully sworn well and faithfully to administer the same.

and bequeath unto the some of four shillings panted or sterling unto one William Knightbridge of Downham upon a mortgage of certain lands and tenements in the parish of Downham in the countie of Westmore by the deed or conveyance in law to me therout made by and from the said William Knightbridge whereunto relation being had doth and more at large appear And I will and bequeath unto the said lands tenements and hereditaments with their appurtenances before mentioned which to my said some Peter shall descend come or arrive by the intent limitation and his means of his said will or otherwise Out of which it shall and may be lawfull unto and for his said Guardian to have take deduct and be allowed from time to time such competent and sufficient allowance for his education and bringing up as hee shall thinke reasonable fitt and convenient for that purpose and also in his discretion And I do make and ordaine my foresaid some cozen Richard Sandell the father full and sole  England to be paid unto the said Denbigh Lake within six monethes next after my decease, if
 he shall then be living. Item I give unto he and Milken daughter of Margaret Speale the sonne
 of five poundes to be paid her within six monethes next after my decease. Item I give unto an
 Elizabeth daughter of John Speale the sonne of one shilling to be paid unto her within six monethes
 next after my decease. Item I give unto William Speale sonne of my sister Asabell the sonne of twenty
 shillings to be paid unto him within six monethes next after my decease. Item I give unto my
 sister Hartwell ten shillings to be paid her within six monethes next after my decease. Item
 I give unto Anne & Catherine sonne of Robert Humbleton my brother in lawe the sonne of
 five shillings to be paid unto him within six monethes next after my decease. Item I give unto
 Vicary Thier of Stevenage and to his sonne Thomas Thier both of them my godsonnes
 ad also unto my daughter and Elizabeth daughter of John Thier of Stevenage aforesaid
 late deceased five shillings a peece to be paid them severally within six monethes next after my
 decease. Item I give unto the three children of my late soper William Lake (vizt) Thomas
 Lake Elizabeth Lake, and also Mervock Lake the sonne of one hundred poundes a peece
 of good and lawfull money of England to be paid unto them or to each of them within six monethes
