be paid by my Executor within three yeeres next after my decease Item
I give unto Elizabeth the wife of Thomas Wyplewman Ten shillings to be paid
by my Executor within three yeeres next after my decease And of the
rest of my goods I doo make my wife Mary Leigh whole and sole
I shall desire Thomas Leigh of Civerton Towne and William Leigh of
Wyplewman the sonne of Robert Leigh to be my Executors to see that my will
be performed And I doo give unto them for their service taken thereon one
shilling a yeere to be paid by my Executor In witness whereof I have
