 the several other Goods and furniture usually being in the said
 best Chamber and also a hanging Press and I give and bequeath

 he shall make choice of with the Bedsteads and Beddings and
 all things thereto belonging and my Cloak with the Appurtenances

their Executors Administrators and Assigns for ever and my
Will is that the Receipts of the said Elizabeth and Susanna from
time to time shall be a good and sufficient discharge for any
sum or sums of money notwithstanding their Coverture / paid
by the said Peregrine Lascelles and George Maxwell them or
