All the rest of my goodes whatsover and debtes whatsover after my debtes and Legacies and funerall charges payed and discharged I give and bequeath unto my loving friend William Whetstone Notary publique conditionally that he shall keepe and mainteyne my aged Mate for Agnes Manstie with sufficient meate drinke apparell bedding and all other nett charges whatsover during her naturall life. And I make and ordayne the sayed William Whetstone my sole and onlie executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and scale the day and yere first abovesayd in the presence of the shewethes herunderwritten Henry Manstie. Subscribed sealed and acknowledged for his last will and testament in the presence of John Evans. Memorandum that I the sayed Henry Manstie doo upon the daye tyme and place abovesayd give and bequeath to my brother Thomas and Edward the somme of sixe poundes of lawfull money of England equally to be divided betwixt them. Item I give and bequeath unto Nicholas the sayed sister some the somme of fforre poundes yf he shall chape the shute whereof he is now seise. And my will is that the sayed Legacies shall be payed at the tyme that the other Legacies are to be payed. Item I give and bequeath unto my Servantes Thomas Duggins and William Gurnett the somme of tenne poundes of lawfull money of England equally to be divided betwixt them to be payed as is abovesayd yf they shall live. As for my worldlie goodes which yt hath pleased god to endowe me withall I bequeathe as hereafter followeth viz. Item first I give and bequeathe all my wages that is due or maye be due to me by vertue of this voyage for my service done in the good shipp called the Red Dragon of London unto my very loving friend Robert Barrall dwelling with M^r Hemmings at Tower hill in London. Item I give and bequeathe all my clothes which I have in the shipp both linnen and waollen Bedd and bedding and all other thinges els which apperteyning or belongeth to me unto my very loving friend Robert Collyng.
