Item I gme and bequeath unto my Sister Ellen Rose the somme of twentie shillinges of like lawfull money of England. And which sayed Legacie I will to be payed to the parties abovenamed within halfe a yere after my decease. All the rest of my goodes chattells and debtes whatsoeuer after my debtes and Legacie's and funerall charges paied and discharged. I gme and bequeath unto my loving friends within whereto Notaries publique conditionally that he shall kepe and maynteyne my agnes Agnes Mansie with sufficient meate drinke apparel Lodging and all other necessarie serues whatsoeuer during her naturall life. And I make and ordaine the said William Whetstone my sole and onlie executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have set my hand and sealed the day and yere first above written in the presence of the witnessses hereunder written Henry Mansie Unframed sealed and acknowledged for his last will and testamant in the presence of John Evans. Memorand that I the sayed Henry Mansie do upon the daye tyme and place aforesaid give and bequeath to my brothers Thomas and Edward the summe of sixe pounds of lawfull money of England equallic to be divided betwixt them. Item I gme and bequeath unto Nicholas and my sayed sister somme the summe of tenne pounds of the same to be payed therewithal whercoft he is nowe sick. And my will is that the sayd Legacie's halfe payed at the tyme that the other Legacie's are to be payed. Item I gme and bequeath unto my Servantes Thomas Hugge and William Gunnell the summe of tenne pounds of lawfull money of England equallic to be divided betwixt them to be payed as aforesayd vntill they shall live. shall please god my soule and bodye shall be separete As for my worldlie goodes whch vt
hath pleased god to endevoure withall I bequeath ab hereafter followeth Item first I
gne and bequeath all my wages that is due or maye bedue to me by vertue of this voyage for
my servit done in the godly^r shipp called the Red Dragon of London unto my very loving friend
Robert Barrell dwelling with M^r Heminge at Tower hill in London Item I gne and bequeath
all my clothes whch I haue in the shipp bothe linnen and woollen Bedd and bedding and all
other thinges else whch apperteyning or belongeth to me unto my very loving friend Robert
Collyngs And my witness hercose I haue caused this my will to be made and haue reme^r
