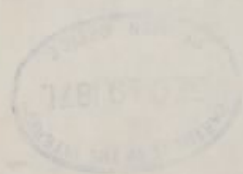

Barker, Judge of the Probate Court, a Court of Record in and for the County and State aforesaid, Henry S. Sake, aged Seventy years, a resident of Seneca County of Michigan, State of Michigan, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is married; that his wife's name was Eliza Sake to whom he was married at St. Louis Mo. on the 22 day of March, 1822; that he served the full period of sixty days in the Military Service of the United States in the War of 1812; that he is the identical Henry Sake who (2) Seneca in Captain Alexander Williams Company, Seneca Regiment, Seneca Brigade, Seneca Division, at Seneca Seneca on the twelfth day of May, 1813, and was honorably discharged at Seneca on the twelfth day of May, 1813; that (3)

that he, at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States adhered to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of any office whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; and that he will support the Constitution of the United States; that he is not in receipt of a pension under any previous act; that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension rolls of the United States, under the provisions of the act approved February 14, 1871, and he hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, WM. E. PRESTON, Licensed Military Claim Agent, of Cleveland, Ohio, his true and lawful attorney, to prosecute his claim, and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that his POST OFFICE ADDRESS IS at Seneca County of Michigan, State of Michigan; that his domicile or place of abode is Seneca County of Michigan.
