Joseph T., the eldest son by second wife, married Nancy Barnhill, of Edinburg, Ind., and soon after moved to Iowa; later on, removed to Walnut, Crawford Co., Kan., where he lived many years. He had a large family. The first was named James; then followed Franklin Pierce, Martha Levina, Sarah, William, Ella, Benjamin and Albert; several children died in infancy, names not known. Franklin P. married Mary Brooks, and to them were born eight children, namely, Walter Brooks, Henrietta, Pearl Elizabeth, Olive Myrtle, Margaret Greene, Elmer Paul, Franklin Niel and Jessie (dead.) Franklin P.'s eldest daughter married W. C. Scott, a Baptist minister of Kansas City, Kan., and moved west—has one child, Marian. Walter is a painter by trade, and has one child, a girl named Louisa. Martha L., oldest daughter, married Julius Forester, of Iowa, and they have one son and one daughter. Their names are Maud and Ross. Ray, the twin brother of Ross, died at the age of eleven.
