By Virtue of two Warrants from the Council of proprietors to me directed the first bears date the Eleventh day of November one thousand seven hundred and Eighteen requiring the Surveyor General to Survey to Jacob Hewlings the quantity of one thousand and Ninety three Acres of land anywhere in the Western Division of the Province of New Jersey and the other warrant bears date the Ninth day of April one thousand seven hundred thirty and six requiring me to Survey to the said Jacob Hewlings the quantity of two hundred thirty and four Acres of land in said Western Division of said Province therefore I have caused part of the said two parcels of land to be surveyed to the said Jacob Hewlings by my lawful Deputy William Hewlings situate in the Township of Bethlehem in the County of Mordredon in the province aforesaid on Muskonetcong Hills and is bounded as followeth. Beginning at a Hickory Sapling corner to land of Thomas deak near a small Brook and near a beech tree marked **WI** and runs by land of William Hewlings South Sixty eight degrees West one hundred and ten chains to a Black Oak marked **H** thence South twenty two degrees East forty five chains to a hickory tree marked **HI** thence North Sixty eight degrees East Sixty chains to a Black Oak marked **WI** standing

near a Road that crosses the Hill in the West Jersey Society's Land then by the same North forty nine degrees East twenty Chains to one of their corners then North forty three degrees East thirty two Chains to another of their corners thence North fifty six degrees East four Chains to one other of their corners then North forty nine degrees East seven Chains to their corner thence North forty two degrees West twenty three Chains and forty links to the Hickory tree first mentioned Surveyed for four ^{hundred} thousand and twenty eight acres with allowance for High Ways. Witness my hand the twenty ninth day of June 1750.

YOU or either of you are hereby Required to lay out and Survey to and for Charles Read Esq^r. the Just Quantity of Five thousand Three hundred & Seventy eight Acres of Land any where in the Western Division of of the Province of New Jersey Where Legally purchased of the Indians and not before Lawfully Surveyed Wherein you are to Observe rules and Orders Prescribed for the Laying out of Lands and make Return thereof, and of your Proceedings therein; To the Council of Proprietors at their next Sitting after the Survey of the same And for your so doing this shall be your Sufficient Warrant Given under my hand and Seal this Ninth day of April One thousand Seven hundred and fifty one (1751.)
