followeth Beginning at a Hickory sapling corner to a land
of Thomas Leah near a small Brook and near a Beach
tree marked WI and runs by land of William Heu-
lings South Sixty eight degrees West one hundred and
ten chains to a Black Oak marked H Hence South
Twenty two degrees East forty five chains to a Chestnut
tree marked EI Hence North Sixty eight degrees East
Sixty chains to a Black Oak marked WI standing

Lawfully Surveyed. Wherein you are to Observe
rules and Orders Prescribed for the laying out
of Lands and make Return thereof, and of your Pro-
ceedings therein; To the Council of Proprietors at
their next Sitting after after the Survey of the same
And for your so doing this Shall be your Suffi-
cient Warrant Given under my hand and Seal
this Ninth day of April One thousand Seven Hun-
dred and fifty one (1751.)
