In pursuance of your order to me Directed bearing Date
of twenty ninth Day of April anno Dom 1756 ordering me
to Survey unto Thos. David & Elijah Clark & full Quantity of
one Hundred acres of Land in any part unappropriated in
the Western Division of New Jersey I have Surveyed part
of so one Hundred acres of Land in two Lots lying Situate
in the County of Gloucester toward the Head of Mullican River
& westerly side of so River up a certain Branch called
Shoehaque & first Lott Being Cedar Swamp lying ~~against~~
adjoining in y^e aforesaid Branch on the Southerly side of a lot
of cedar swamp formerly Survey to Nathaniel Cripps but now
is in the possession of Thos Thomas and David and Elijah Clark

Beging at a pine tree mark on four sides for a corner by y^e side
of so cedar swamp and Run thence first North twelve Deg.
East five chain to cedar in ^{line} of Cripps Thence Secondly
along in y^e line of so Cripp North eighty four Deg. West
Twenty chain to cedar for a corner thence leaving Cripps line
Thirty South twelve Deg. West and so through swamp and so up a
Branch Sixteen chain to a pine for a corner thence Southly East
four chain passing so small Branch to cedar for a corner thence fifty
North twelve Deg East Down y^e small branch ten chain and fifty
links to a post thence Sixthly Down y^e main Branch South eighty four Deg.
East sixteen chain to y^e first mentioned pine ^{allowance} containing fourteen acres and
one tenth of an acre strict measure ^{allowance} of Second lot is cedar swamp
and lyeth Situate about ten chain to y^e westward of y^e former
Beginning at pine tree for a corner mark on four sides standing
on y^e Southerly side of another small Branch y^e puts out of y^e
main Branch and extends first South eighty one Deg. West
fifteen chain to cedar sapling for corner thence Secondly North
four chain to a post across y^e Branch thence Thirty North eighty
one Deg. East fifteen chain to cedar for a corner thence
South across y^e Branch for chain to y^e first mentioned
pine containing five acres & ^{allowance} tenth of an acre strict measure
Both lots make Ninety acres strict measure after allowance
for Highways leaves Nineteen acres Cham Bevers were
