of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, of which Queen he is at this time a subject

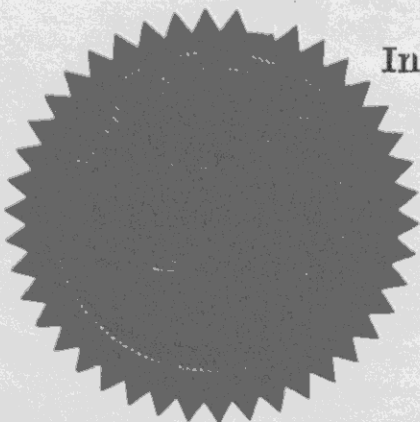
