PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Passaic County, N.J.

The petition of Max Lake hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 73 Jackson St. Passaic N.J. (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

Second. My occupation is Salesman

Third. I was born on the 4th day of July, anno Domini 1875, at Pernitshke Russia

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Rotterdam Netherlands, on or about the 13th day of October

anno Domini 1904, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 15th day of October

anno Domini 1904, on the vessel Rotterdam (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 3rd day of June, anno Domini 1908

at Passaic N.J. in the Court of Common Pleas of Passaic County N.J.

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Lena Lake nee (Gale) She was born

in Romni Russia, and now resides at 73 Jackson St. Passaic N.J. (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

I have children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Nicholas II, Emperor of all the Russias of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for a term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 25th day of October, anno Domini 1904, and in the State of New Jersey, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 25th day of October, anno Domini 1904, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. I made petition for citizenship to the Court of Passaic County at Passaic N.J. on the 15th day of March, anno Domini 1903, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, witness John Taylor not a citizen and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

Declaration of Intention and Certificate of Arrival No. From Department of Labor filed this 20th day of November, 1913.

each being severally, duly, and respectively sworn, deposes and says that he is a citizen of the United States of America; that he has personally known Max Lake, the petitioner above mentioned, to have resided in the United States continuously immediately preceding the date of filing his petition, since the day of April, anno Domini 1907, and in the State in which the above-entitled petition is made continuously since the day of April, anno Domini 1907, and that he has personal knowledge that the said petitioner is a person of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and that the petitioner is in every way qualified, in his opinion, to be admitted a citizen of the United States.


