I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S. 9934, it appears that John Lake was born March 36, 1756 in Dutchess County, New York.

While residing at Beekman, Dutchess County, New York, he enlisted April or May 1778 and served five months as a private in Captain Joseph Reynolds' Company, Colonel Lee's New York Regiment.

He enlisted in the spring of 1779 and served eight months as a private in Captain Woods! Company, Colonel DuBois! New Year $Resine_{nc}$.

He enlisted in the spring of 1780 and served five months as a private in Captain Woods' Company, Colonel


Bostwick's New York Regiment and was in the battle of Stone Arabia.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 24, 1832, while a resident of Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County, New York.

There is no data on file as to his family.






