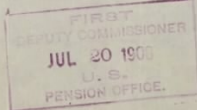

Dear Sir:— Your very valuable reply concerning one of the Henry Lakes of the River, for his pension papers, is at hand and had one especially interesting and intrinsic feature that I appreciate greatly— viz— showing whom the father of Henry Lake was, a thing we were most positive of, and furthermore showing he had a daughter Lucretia which enabled the correct placing of this Henry Lake into the proper Branch of the American Lakes.

On July 27 078 It now becomes me to get the record of the other Henry Lake of New York, as far as his family is revealed through his pension papers, and in compliance with your instructions, as to date I should tender will say that all I know of positively regarding him is that he was a private in the 27th Reg. of U.S. Infantry and was placed on the pension roll July 21, 1878. The pension commencing June 18, 1875. Do not know where he was born. Every detail touching on who the members of this family— father, wife, children— were will be especially valuable— also copy of any affidavits that will reveal his place & time of birth, residence to other towns, occupation &c.

Sir:

In reply to your letter dated the 17th and received the 20th inst., you are advised that from the papers in the claim, Sur. File 27078, it appears that while Henry Lake was serving as Private in Capt. Christian Hartell's company, 27 U. S. Infantry at Sandy Hook in December 1914, he incurred a rupture for which he was pensioned from June 18, 1915.

In an affidavit executed in New York City on Jan. 5, 1916, he refers to his wife and six small children. No names stated and no further family data.

Capt. Christian Hartells company 27th Regt.

Madenath to assist in removing a Blacksmiths shop at Sandy Hook, that in this act of his duty he overstrained himself by lifting and that in consequence he received a rupture in the left Scrotum, that confined him for a considerable time, this deponent further saith that he was a private in Capt. Christian Hartells company 27th Regt US Infantry, and that the rupture he then and there received has never been cured and that by reason of said rupture he is totally disabled from doing military duty or earning a subsistence for himself a wife and six small children by manual labour.

doth depose and say that he was attached to the 27th Reg^t in the service of the United States that in the month of December 1864, he received an order from the commanding officer Major James D. Madsen with a fatigue party of 30 soldiers for the purpose of removing a Blacksmith's shop at Sandy Hook to make barracks of the same that he proceeded on this duty, that among the number of men selected on this occasion was Henry Lake, a private in Capt^{cy} Christian Bartlett's company in which company this deponent was first Lieutenant, and that while in the act of taking the said Blacksmith's shop, most of the men on that duty loosed their hold and the said Henry Lake was left nearly by himself in this situation by overstraining himself he received a rupture in his left groin and was immediately sent to his quarters and remained there nearly two months, doing no duty this deponent further saith that he was the greater part of the time in command of the company, and that said Henry Lake is by means of said rupture rendered unfit for military duty or to earn a subsistence for himself & family by manual labour.
