
In roply to your lotter dated the 17" and received the 20" inst., you are advised that from the papers in the claim, Sur. File 27078, it appears that while Henry Lake was serving as Private in Capt. Christian Hartell's company, 27 U. S. Infantry at Sandy Hook in December 1814, he incurred a rupture for which he was pensioned from June 18, 1815.

In an affidavit executed in New York City on Jan. 5, 1818, he refers to his wife and six small childron. No names stated and no further family data.






