On this 7th day of May A.D. 1855 One thousand eight hundred & fifty five personally appeared before me J. B. W. Haynes a Justice of the peace duly authorized to administer oaths within and for the County of Union and State of Ohio, Josiah Lake, aged 62 years, a resident of Delaware County, in the State of Ohio, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Josiah Lake who was a private in the company of detached Militia from Orange County, in the State of New York, Commanded by Captain Thomas Jackson, to guard the City and harbor of N. York, Staten island head quarters quarantine Under Major B. Maney in the war with Great Britain declared by the United States on the 18th day of June A.D. 1812, that he was drafted at Orange County, Township of Norwich in the State of New York on the 8th day of September A.D. 1814 for the term of Three months and continued in actual service Three months and four days and was honorably discharged at Staten island head quarters quarantine on the 12th day of December A.D. 1814 on account of expiration of term of service, as will appear by the muster rolls of said company, and as will appear by his original certificate of discharge now on file in the office of Commissioners of Pensions with application for bounty land, under Act of Sept. 28th A.D. 1850, - that he heretofore received a warrant for Forty acres, under act of Sept. 28th A.D. 1850, and that he has disposed of the same as follows: Sold and assigned to W. M. Bridge (don't remember the number of the warrant)

That he hereby constitutes and appoints W. M.

Borgeson of Richwood, Union County, Ohio his
attorney, to do all that may be necessary on this declaration
for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which he
may be entitled under "An Act in addition to certain
acts granting bounty land to certain officers & soldiers
who have been engaged in the Military service of
the United States" Approved Dec of March AD 1865;
never having applied for, received, or known that
he is entitled under any former act of Congress,
other than as above indicated.

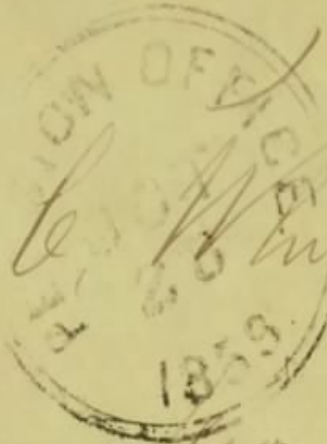

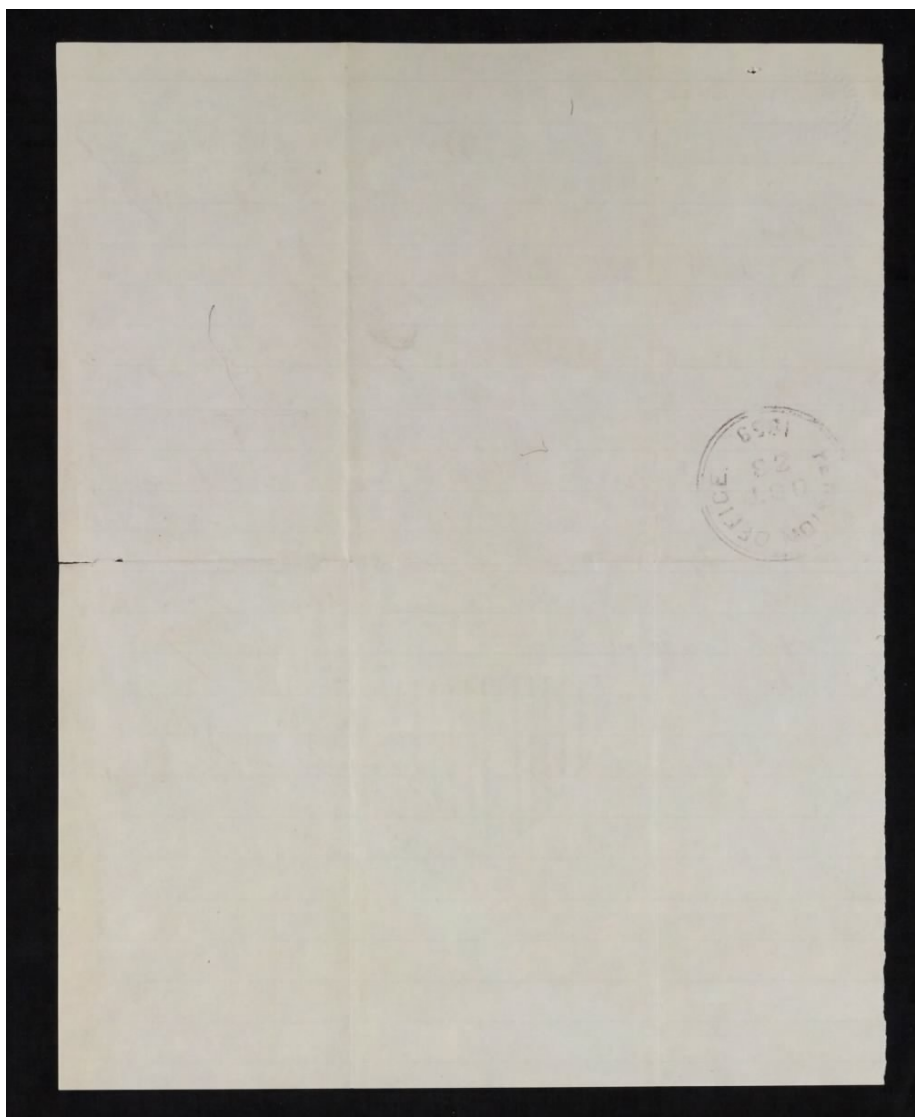

On this twenty third day of November A. D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty, personally appeared before me, William P. Reid a Notary Public duly authorized to administer oaths within and for the County and State aforesaid, Josiah Lake aged fifty years, a resident of Delaware County in the State of Ohio who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Josiah Lake who was a private in the Company commanded by Captain Thomas Jackson in the Orange County Regiment of New York Militia commanded by Lieut. Col. Michael Smith in the war with Great Britain declared by the United States June 18th 1812, that he was drafted at Orange County New York on or about the 28th day of September A. D. 1814 for the term of three months and continued in actual service in said war for the term of three months and was honorably discharged at Staten Island on the 12th day of December A. D. 1814 on account of the expiration of his term of service as will appear by his certificate of discharge hence attached and made part of the muster rolls of said Company.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which he may be entitled under the "act granting bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," passed September 28th, 1850.

the County and State aforesaid, Joseph Lake, aged 75
years, a resident of Northwood, in Warren County,
State of Ohio, who being duly sworn, according to law, declares
that he is not married (his wife having died some years
ago); that he received the full benefit of forty days in
the military service of the United States in the year of 1862;
that he is the son of said Joseph Lake who was drafted as
volunteer in Captain Thomas Jackson Coffey's Company of detachable
artillery from Cuyahoga County, State of Ohio, A.D. 1861,
or about the 8th of September 1861, and was lawfully
discharged at Athens, Ohio, on or about the 15th of
December 1861; that his military name was Abraham
Smith; that his military name was changed; that during
time of his service he was with others, guarding the city
and banks of Columbus, but was not in any battle;
that his discharge was sent to the proper authorities
with an application for draft towards said service, and
not of himself; that some years ago after he received
his discharge, that he at no time during the late
rebellion against the authority of the United States, either
to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them
aid, or comfort; or is or was the possessor of any office,
position under any authority or pretended authority.

he makes this declaration for the purpose of being
