Know all Men by these Presents, THAT *Henry Lake of the City, County and State of New York*

have made, constituted and appointed, and by these presents do make, constitute, and appoint *C. W. Bennett Esq., of Washington City,* my true and lawful Attorney for *me*, and in *my* name, place, and stead, to prosecute my *Homestead Land claim No. 280969 under the act of March 3^d 1855 to a final issue, and receive the Land warrant in satisfaction thereof as soon as issued*

giving and granting unto *my* said Attorney full power and authority to do and perform all and every act and thing whatsoever requisite and necessary *to* be done in and about the premises, as fully, to all intents and purposes, as *I* might or could do if personally present, with full power of substitution, and revocation, hereby ratifying and confirming all that *my* said Attorney or *his* substitute shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue hereof.

day of April 1855 Lighten Hymcher
and sixty personally came before me
a Commissioner of deeds within and
for the County and state aforesaid
Henry Lake who being by me duly
sworn according to law declared that
he is the identical Henry Lake who
was a Private in the company com-
manded by Captain Richard M.
Malcom in the 13th Regiment of
United States Infantry Command-
ed (he thinks) by Colonel Berriotti in the
war with Great Britain declared by
the United States June 18th 1812 -
that he enlisted on or about the 13th
day of April 1812 for the term of
thirteen months and continued in
actual service in said war for the
said term of thirteen months and
was honorably discharged at Green-
wich in the State of New York on or
about the 13th day of May 1815 and
that during his said service he
was engaged in the battle of Tuscarora
N.Y.

He makes this declaration for the
purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land
to which he may be entitled under
the act approved March 3rd 1855 -
He also declares that he has not
received a warrant for Bounty
Land under this or any other act

of Congress nor made any other
application therefor except his claim
No. 280,969, filed on the 7th day of
September 1857, which he understands,
to be lost in the Pension office -
Hendricks Lake
Main

The foregoing declaration was sub-
scribed and sworn to before me on the
day and year above written; and I
affirm that I am personally well
acquainted with said claimant
and know him to be the identical
person he represents himself to be in
every respect, and that I have no
interest in his claim.
